

**MINUTES
BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS**

The City of Jesup Board of Commissioners held a Special Called meeting Tuesday, June 18, 2019, at 5:00 p.m., in the Council Chamber. Mayor David Earl Keith called the meeting to order. Roll call was as follows:

The Lord's Prayer was led by City Attorney Conner.

The Pledge of Allegiance was led by Police Chief Lane.

Commissioner Harris made motion seconded by Commissioner Todd to approve the 2nd reading of an Ordinance to rezone 462 E. Cherry Street from R-2 to P-R.

All Council voted yes.

Commissioner Harris made motion seconded by Commissioner Armstrong to approve the 2nd reading of the 2019-20 Budget Ordinance.

All Council voted yes.

City Clerk/Treasurer Rose Jackson reviewed the May 2019 Financial Statement. She noted every Department Head has underspent their year-to-date budget.

Commissioner Harvey stated the Magnolia Street Railroad Crossing is still closed. Mayor Keith informed him that a CSX representative would be at the GMA Convention in Savannah on Sunday, June 23, 2019.

Commissioner Darden stated the water at his house is still milky since the water main broke on N. Fourth Street last month. City Manager Deal suggested Commissioner Darden let water run all night to see whether or not that corrects the problem.

Commissioner Darden left to attend his Leadership Wayne graduation.

Commissioner Todd inquired about the start date on repair to the McMillan Creek Greenway Boardwalk. City Manager Deal stated the contractor has started work by cutting a path to get to the damaged areas.

Commissioner Todd asked about the electronic sign on West Cherry Street to be donated to the City by the Chamber of Commerce. Mayor Keith stated the transition hasn't taken place yet.

Commissioner Harris asked City Manager Deal why the water in the Train Depot water fountain doesn't spray up high anymore. City Manager Deal stated the water was turned down because it was splashing out, but can be turned back up again.

Commissioner Armstrong reported water sits beside Freewill Baptist Church on Walnut Street when it rains. She also stated resident on N. Fourth Street requested "Child at Play" sign because she has an autistic child.

Mayor Keith announced the City received a Certificate of Appreciation from the Jesup Shrine Club in appreciation of valuable contributions, generosity and support to their organization.

Commissioner Harris made motion seconded by Commissioner Todd to go into Executive Session to discuss Legal & Personnel issues.

All Council present voted yes.

Upon returning, Mayor Keith reported no action was taken in Executive Session.
