Public Works Department

Mr. Eddie Williams, the Public Works Director, has some tips to make your life a little easier.

The Recycle Center, located at 555 N. First Street, across from the City Cemetery, is open Monday through Saturday from 7a.m. to 6p.m. It is closed on holidays. The center accepts newspaper, aluminum, white goods, glass, plastic, metals, and household trash. It does not accept yard debris and tires.

Curbside recycle pickup is on Wednesdays. If your zip code is 31546, your pickup is on the first and third Wednesday of the month. If your zip code is 31545, then your pickup is on the second and fourth Wednesday. We do not pick up on the fifth Wednesday of any month.

Household garbage is picked up according to the following schedule:

Monday– south of East Cherry and railroad

Tuesday– north of East Cherry

and railroad

Thursday-south of West Cherry and railroad

Friday-north of West Cherry and railroad

Please have your can out the night before as our drivers start early. Also, make sure your can is on the correct side of the street with the handles facing away from the street. After your can is emptied we ask that you take it back off the curb and into your yard. Only household garbage items are allowed to be put in your garbage can.

Yard debris, such as limbs and leaves, can be taken to the Goose Creek Inert Landfill on Highway 169. If a landscaper or contractor does any work at your home, they are responsible for removal of any debris.

We will remove limbs and leaves from your yard provided they are placed by the curb, but not in the road. Leaves may not be bagged; and limbs must not be longer than five foot. Please avoid extremely heavy items because



the truck will not be able to pick it up.

For the safety of our drivers and for your own safety, we ask that you do not put any yard debris, garbage cans, or recycle cans under power lines or next to power poles. The driver will not pick it up if it is in a dangerous spot.

Every Drop Counts

Would you like to save a few dollars on your water bill? Then here are a few tips to help you conserve on water.

Check for toilet leaks. A leaking toilet will run your water bill up a lot. Put some food coloring in the back of the tank. If the toilet is leaking, the color will appear in the bowl within 30 minutes.

Don't let the water

run while you are shaving, brushing your teeth, or washing your face.

Load your dishwasher fully before you run it. It uses the same amount of water no matter how much is in it.

Reuse your fish tank water to water your plants. It makes a nice fertilizer too.

Repair dripping faucets. If your faucet is dripping at a rate of one drop per second, you will waste 2,700 gal-

lons of water per year.

Don't hose down your driveway. Use a broom instead.

Remember that you are in control of your water usage. Make sure to set a good example by making your children aware of the need to conserve water. Try to do one thing a day to conserve water. Every person can make a difference.
